#### **GLOSSARY**

**Research**: Research includes all forms of internal or external research involving service recipients, except internal program evaluation and outcomes research, and educational projects carried out by students and interns as part of their professional training. (http://coanet.org/standard/eth/6/)

**Related Services:** Clinical services are those services which provide therapeutic supports so that the student/client can benefit from his/her educational program. These therapeutic services can include, *but are not limited to*, speech therapy, occupational therapy, physical therapy, art therapy, music therapy, ABA therapy and counseling.

**Governance:** In non-profit agencies, governance refers to oversight by a governing board. In for profit agencies, governance refers to oversight by owner(s).

<u>Curriculum:</u> The framework of an educational program. It ultimately determines the skills and competencies that student/client/students will learn. While subject matter, methods, and techniques may vary, the delivery of curriculum requires balancing the demands of traditional subject matter and methods with the unique needs of the individual learner.
